Road serves as a poignant symbol of this upheaval, where burnt-out RVs and vanished residents speak volumes about the struggles of the marginalized.

A long time ago in the Middle East, a young baby boy was taken by his parents in the middle of the night to a foreign land – for the child's safety. He became a refugee, moved and displaced. He later returned and re-settled in His homeland. His name was Jesus. He can readily identify with displacement and a lack of home and a lack of hope.

We, The Salvation Army, endeavour to follow in Jesus' footsteps by representing Him in the 'hood. That means visiting and engaging with the former residents of Lonzo road and other homeless areas of the city. That means supplying clients and residents with basic necessities of life and well-being. At the Centre of Hope we connect them with resources to help them meet their goals for renewal.

#### THE SALVATION ARMY IN PUERTO VALLARTA, MEXICO IS AN EXCITING PLACE TO BE!

Four years ago, Ron and Jennifer Bonar began a ministry with the officers to serve the children and adults in a poor neighbourhood on the outskirts of Puerto Vallarta. A nutritious lunch was provided for approximately 20-25 children per day, as well as crafts, personal care items, school supplies and Sunday school material. This was during the covid period and restrictions hampered any other activities as well as bringing in more children.

Many family members and friends have been helping with various aspects of the programs over the last few years.

In the fall of 2021, we contacted Rob Studiman at The Salvation Army's Centre of Hope in Abbotsford and he graciously had his staff put aside some clothes and shoes for us to take to Mexico for the children. This relationship has grown the last two years and this past winter we were able to take three full suitcases full of donations, mostly from the Thrift Store. Fortunately, West Jet allows us to take suitcases for charitable causes at no charge. We are extremely grateful to Rob and his staff for helping us support the children.

In January 2023, with help from others we were able to start a soccer team for the U-11 children. It took effort but it was a huge success and we quite enjoyed watching the boys and girls playing their favourite game. For most of the children this was their first experience being on a team of any sort, and provided a positive alternative to other activities they may have been engaged in.

In August 2023 new young Officers from the Training College in Mexico were appointed to this Centre. Lieutenants Levi Flores and Jennifer Sanchez are doing an outstanding job in expanding existing programs and creating new ones. Sunday school and church attendance are up, more than fifty children a day are provided a nutritious lunch and children's programs have started, including a choir, guitar band and tambourine group. The children are also enjoying more craft activities, movie nights and English classes.

With the tremendous increase in activities, the priorities for support at this time are funds for various behind the scenes items, such as a new washing machine and more tables and chairs to provide a designated area for helping with homework, teaching English etc.

We appreciate The Salvation Army in Abbotsford and look forward to more opportunities for partnership as we serve "With Heart to God and Hand to Man".
